This year is the 30th Zig Zag Festival, and the 10th Year of Madjitil Moorna Choir. These two special anniversaries needed a special event to mark it. That's how this year's Spectacular Finale started.

Heritage - the whole **history of Kalamunda**, from the first peoples - to the present day - in song and dance and music and lights. A children's choir of hundreds of children drawn from schools across Perth will be singing in language, alongside the Madjitil Moorna Choir to tell the first people's story of the tracks through the Forest.

The Black Chooks will play the folk tunes from Europe, signalling the arrival of Migrants. Coming from the sea, from Europe and from China, next, A Kappella Munda Choir will recall their songs. They came to the forest and they cut down trees.

Then the trains come: snaking their way up the side of Gooseberry Hill and the Junkadelic Brass Band will take the story forward as trains cart away the timber. The people build their homes in the clearings, planting orchards and grape vines, and their houses become the village we now call Kalamunda – our home in the forest. As for the future, that's for the children to make.
